## **Policy Update**

#### **Biden Releases National COVID-19 Strategy**

On January 21, President Biden released a <u>national strategy</u> on COVID-19 and committed to a transparent, science-based, equitable COVID-19 response. In the national strategy, there are specific actions that will be taken to address COVID-19 pandemic, bring down the number of cases and increase vaccine distribution. A <u>summary</u> was also released.

Biden and the COVID team will hold regular public briefings and release regular science-based reports. The White House also plans to publicly share data and performance measures that will support COVID-19 recovery, including those related to cases, testing, vaccination and hospital admissions. The administration hopes to make the information available in real-time to officials at the federal, state and local levels in the near future.

## **Provider Update**

CDC Confirms that Hospice and Home Healthcare Workers are Essential for Vaccine Prioritization CMS confirmed with CDC this week the hospice and home healthcare workers are considered essential workers and should be prioritized for COVID-19 vaccines.
