

Better Care, Lower Cost


NORC at the University of Chicago, an independent, non-partisan research institution, used Medicare claims data to develop a comprehensive study of hospice's savings to the Medicare program. Here's what they found.

FINDINGS

In 2019, hospice saved Medicare:

\$3.5bn

NORC estimates that Medicare spending for those who received hospice care was \$3.5 billion less in 2019 than it would have been had they not received hospice care.

FINDINGS

Hospice is associated with lower Medicare end-of-life expenditures when hospice lengths of stay are longer than ten days Hospice is available to anyone with a prognosis of 6 months or less to live. Educating patients about the options could mean more patients choosing hospice earlier, which would create savings for Medicare, reduce unwanted medical interventions, and likely improve quality of care at the end of life.



FINDINGS

Hospice stays of six months or more result in savings for Medicare

For those who spent at least six months in hospice in the last year of their lives, Medicare spending was on average 11% lower than the adjusted spending on beneficiaries who did not use hospice.



FINDINGS

Hospice care benefits patients, family members, and caregivers

Research shows hospice provides:

- Increased satisfaction and quality of life.
- Improved pain control.
- Reduced physical distress.

 Reduced prolonged grief/ other emotional



Among Medicare decedents who identified as...


