CMS Opens Call for Proposals for 2024 Health Equity Conference

CMS Requests Information on the VBID Model

In December, CMS released a <u>request for information</u> (RFI) on the Value-Based Insurance Design (VBID) Model to help inform potential future Model policy development. This RFI seeks information on various aspects of the VBID model, particularly hospice care, including hospice access and network adequacy considerations. This RFI also includes questions regarding health equity, including flexibilities that would enable Medicare Advantage Organizations to target VBID benefits based on certain factors. Comments are due to the VBID Mailbox at <u>VBID@cms.hhs.gov</u> by **January 31**.

Fast Fact #476: Serious-Illness Considerations for the Unrepresented and Adult Orphans

In clinical contexts, unrepresented persons are adults who lack capacity for medical decisionmaking, have no legally documented health care proxy (HCP), and have no identified family or friends to serve as surrogate decision-makers. The term adult orphan refers to an individual at risk for becoming unrepresented – they retain medical decision-making capacity but lack an HCP or surrogate. Both groups are vulnerable to goal-discordant care since they have no trusted individual to advocate for their values. While there are no national standards on how to care for the unrepresented and laws vary state to state, <u>this Fast Fact</u> incorporates expert opinions and consensus statements from the American Thoracic Society and American Geriatric Society to address the serious-illness care needs of these patient populations.
