#### Hospice PEPPER Distribution to Be Delayed Through Fall 2024

In November, the CBRPEPPER <u>website</u> went down. In response, NHPCO reached out to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) requesting an update and a timeframe for an expected fix. The website recently provided an update indicating that there will be a temporary pause in distributing comparative billing reports (CBRs) and Program for Evaluating Payment Patterns Electronic Reports (PEPPERs) in effect through the fall of 2024. The website also indicates that CMS is working to improve the quality and accessibility of these reports and will be releasing a Request for Information (RFI) soon. NHPCO is reaching out to CMS for additional details and will share more information as the situation develops.

#### **REGULATORY & COMPLIANCE**

#### CMS Publishes Hospice MFT and MHC Guidance

On November 3, the CMS released the <u>calendar year (CY) 2024 Payment Policies under the Physician Fee Schedule and Other Changes to Part B Payment and Coverage Policies</u> final rule, which implements provisions of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023, to include mental health counselors (MHCs) and marriage and family therapists (MFTs) as part of the hospice interdisciplinary group (IDG) beginning January 1, 2024. In response to NHPCO's request for additional clarity about these services under the hospice benefit, CMS published an <u>MFT and MHC Q&A Document</u>. #### Updated Deadline: CMS Requests Information on the VBID Model

In December, CMS released a <u>request for information</u> (RFI) on the Value-Based Insurance Design (VBID) Model to help inform potential future Model policy development. This RFI seeks information on various aspects of the VBID model, particularly hospice care, including hospice access and network adequacy considerations. This RFI also includes questions regarding health equity, including flexibilities that would enable Medicare Advantage Organizations to target VBID benefits based on certain factors. Comments are due to the VBID Mailbox at <u>VBID@cms.hhs.gov</u> by <u>Friday</u>, <u>February 16</u>.

NHPCO will be submitting a response to the RFI and is soliciting feedback from its members through <u>a Qualtrics survey</u>. ### Open Door Forum (ODF)

CMS held a Home Health, Hospice, and DME Open Door Forum on Wednesday, January 10. CMS staff communicated that there are no updates on the HOPE Tool and that a Q&A document regarding the addition of marriage and family therapists (MFTs) and mental health counselors (MHCs) to the Interdisciplinary Group will be available soon. Members are encouraged to sign up for the CMS ODF Mailing List to receive future communications regarding Open Door Forums. ## **Evaluation of Grief Support Services (EGGS) Data Submission Deadline**

**Data Submission Deadline:** Data submission for the second half of 2023 is due by January 28, 2024 for the period including July 1 through December 31, 2023. Surveys must be submitted by January 28 to be included in 2023 data.

**About EGSS:** The EGSS survey is a members-only resource designed to evaluate an organization's grief support services from the perspective of the recipients of the services. The survey takes a comprehensive approach by including questions on a wide range of services, many of them optional, so that hospices may tailor the survey to reflect the specific services they offer. #### 2023 National Healthcare Quality and Disparities Report

The <u>National Healthcare Quality and Disparities Report</u> assesses the performance of our healthcare system and identifies strengths and weaknesses, as well as disparities, for access to healthcare and quality of healthcare. Quality measures are grouped into six priorities: patient safety, person-centered care, care coordination, effective treatment, healthy living, and care affordability.

#### **Health Equity Fellowship for Trainees**

The <u>Health Equity Fellowship for Trainees</u> is part of Health Affairs' national initiative to advance equity in health policy and health services scholarly publishing. Fellows receive mentorship from Health Affairs authors and editorial staff, and gain insight into creating manuscript submissions that are more likely to be accepted by the journal or another journal within the fellowship.
