NHPCO Submits Comments to MedPAC

On Wednesday, January 24, NHPCO <u>submitted comments</u> to the Medicare Payment Advisory Commission (MedPAC) on its updated hospice workplan and 2024 recommendation to Congress. In November 2023, MedPAC introduced the <u>updated hospice workplan (PDF)</u> which includes focusing the commission's efforts in years ahead on hospices' effect on Medicare spending, the effect of the hospice aggregate cap, non-hospice spending for beneficiaries enrolled in hospice, and end-of-life care for beneficiaries with end-stage renal disease (ESRD). Earlier



this month the <u>MedPAC commissioners unanimously voted</u> to approve the recommendation for no update to the Medicare hospice base payment rate in 2024. Although MedPAC did not recommend a cut to the hospice aggregate payment cap which is positive, the recommendation to not increase the base payment is a concern. NHPCO will continue to work with MedPAC to educate on the importance of hospice as well as share the struggles providers are facing.

Need for CMS Oversight Reform Highlighted in New ProPublica Article

A ProPublica article published today, <u>Medicare Certifies Hospices in California Despite State Banon New Licenses</u>, highlights that despite increased hospice program integrity oversight by CMS in 2023, "four states continued to drive most of the growth of new Medicare-certified hospices in the country, with two-thirds of all certifications taking place there." Last January, NHPCO, in partnership with other national organizations, urged CMS and Congress to <u>enact targeted program integrity recommendations</u> to stop bad actors that do not live up to the standards of high-quality care expected from members of the community. Many of those recommendations <u>have been enacted</u> in 2023, helping create what ProPublica labels a "banner year" for hospice reform. Yet, as the article makes clear, further, targeted oversight improvements are needed to root out bad actors and prevent future fraud. NHPCO <u>continues to work with lawmakers and regulators</u> to advocate for hospice care to stay true to its core values.

NHPCO Finalizes 2023 Hospice Audit Survey Report

Last year, NHPCO was joined by three other national associations in conducting a hospice audit survey to solicit feedback from our members on specific hospice audit experiences and challenges. This survey closed on October 31 with 133 responses received. Responses were substantive and provided detailed information about the specific situations, challenges, and successes experienced by hospices during the audit process. In January, NHPCO completed a report summarizing findings from this survey, which we shared with the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). NHPCO Meeting with CMS Regarding Hospice Audit System Challenges

On January 19, NHPCO met with leaders from the Center for Program Integrity (CPI) at CMS to discuss challenges with the system of hospice audits, including how poorly structured and targeted audits can disrupt hospice operations and harm patient access to care. The meeting included NHPCO staff leadership and representatives from member hospices. CPI staff were engaged in the discussion and indicated they would consider feedback in the effort to identify ways to improve the hospice audit process. NHPCO will continue to identify opportunities to engage with CPI in the future.

Updated Deadline: CMS Requests Information on the VBID Model

In December, CMS released a <u>request for information</u> (RFI) on the Value-Based Insurance Design (VBID) Model to help inform potential future Model policy development. This RFI seeks information on various aspects of the VBID model, particularly hospice care, including hospice access and network adequacy considerations. This RFI also includes questions regarding health equity, including flexibilities that would enable Medicare Advantage Organizations to target VBID benefits based on certain factors. Comments are due to the VBID Mailbox at <u>VBID@cms.hhs.gov</u> by <u>Friday, February 16</u>.

NHPCO will submit a response to the RFI and is soliciting feedback from its members through <u>a</u> <u>Qualtrics survey</u>. Topical Guide: Intergenerational Engagement

The 2023 U.S. Surgeon General's <u>Advisory on the Healing Effects of Social Connection and Community</u> calls attention to the importance of social connection for individual health, community-wide metrics of health and wellbeing, and the significant consequences when social connection is lacking. The <u>Commit to Connect</u> initiative from the Association for Community Living aims to increase awareness and availability of programs that address social isolation and loneliness. This <u>topical guide</u> from the initiative introduces programs that are utilizing intergenerational engagement as a method to address social isolation and loneliness as well as tips for organizations to build their own intergenerational programing.

The Role of Work in Health Disparities

This <u>grant from the National Institutes of Health (NIH)</u> will support research to identify pathways and mechanisms through which work influences health outcomes and status among populations with health disparities, and how work functions as a social determinant of health.
