CMS Requests Information on Medicare Advantage Data

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) recently released a <u>request for information</u> (RFI) on Medicare Advantage (MA) data to help strengthen CMS MA data capabilities and inform potential future policy development. This RFI seeks information on all aspects of MA program data, including, among other things, care access data-related recommendations, prior authorization and utilization management, and supplemental benefit cost and utilization. CMS also published an accompanying <u>press release</u>. Comments on the RFI are due by <u>Wednesday, May 29</u>. NHPCO will be submitting a response to the RFI.

Integrative Therapies in Hospice and Palliative Care Program is a nine-part program for multidisciplinary health professionals on integrative approaches in hospice and palliative care. The course covers the evolution of the concept of integrative care in the US, explains how integrative therapies share a holistic and multidimensional approach with palliative care, and examines the concept of "evidence" in making informed decisions about the use of integrative therapies. The Impact of COVID-19 on Healthcare Coverage and Access in Racial and Ethnic Minority Populations

The COVID-19 pandemic disproportionately affected already disadvantaged racial and ethnic minority populations and highlighted persistent health disparities among Black, Hispanic, Native American, and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander populations. A new paper, "The impact of COVID-19 on healthcare coverage and access in racial and ethnic minority populations in the United States," in Geospatial Health describes changes in health insurance coverage, healthcare access, and reasons for non-insurance among racial/ethnic minority populations in the United States before and during the COVID-19 pandemic using four national survey datasets.

Geriatrics Workforce Enhancement Program

This cooperative agreement from the <u>Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA)</u> will support the education and training of healthcare workforces to care for older adults by collaborating with community partners. If interested, the deadline to apply is February 26.

Ground Work: Racial Justice and Cultural Humility Training for Health Centers

The National Association of Community Health Centers' <u>Ground Work training</u> is designed to help the health center field level-set on the concepts of racial identity, privilege, bias, and structural and institutional racism. Ground Work provides the background information and the tools for any health center staff to engage in health equity and anti-racism work in their community.
