2023 Program Year Concludes - Congratulations Participants!

The 2023 Quality Connections Program Year has come to an end. All activities completed through January 31, 2024 will be included in the year-end <u>Achievement Map</u> update that will occur on February 16. Participating members received their program year achievement emblems via email earlier this week.

NHPCO is proud to celebrate participants in the 2023 program who collectively closed 361 achievement rings. Of the 300 participating programs, 83 organizations earned top recognition as a "four rings" program. Notably, four-ring achievement increased nearly fourfold from 2022, with the number of organizations closing rings increasing by nearly twenty percent and the total rings achieved increasing by eighty-nine percent. REGULATORY & COMPLIANCE

CMS Releases Proposed Rule to Strengthen Oversight of Accrediting Organizations

On February 8, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released a proposed rule, Medicare Program: Strengthening Oversight of Accrediting Organizations and Preventing Accrediting Organization Conflict of Interest, and Related Provisions. This rule aims to increase oversight of CMS-approved accrediting organizations (AOs), which survey healthcare providers and suppliers who participate in the Medicare and Medicaid programs. CMS also published an accompanying fact sheet. Comments on the proposed rule are due by 5 p.m. ET on Monday, April 15.

CMS Announces Call for Nominations for 2024 Health Equity Award

CMS has announced a call for nominations for the <u>2024 CMS Health Equity Award</u>. This award is intended to acknowledge organizations that demonstrate reduced disparities in healthcare quality, access, or outcomes among vulnerable populations, such as racial and ethnic minorities, individuals with disabilities, sexual and gender minorities, and those living in rural areas. CMS will recognize awardees at the <u>CMS Health Equity Conference</u> May 29-30. <u>Nomination forms</u> should be submitted to <u>omh@cms.hhs.gov</u>, with the subject 'ATTN: CMS Health Equity Award' by March 13.

QUALITY

Project ECHO Miniseries: Best Practices in Dementia Care

NHPCO, in collaboration with the Alzheimer's Association, will be hosting a new <u>Project ECHO</u> <u>miniseries</u> beginning March 7. This seven-session, weekly miniseries focuses on implementation of evidence-based dementia care, specifically in serious illness and at the end of life, and will support and enhance the ability of providers across the continuum of care to understand the unique needs of persons living with various facets of cognitive impairment. HQRP Updates

Providers can now access May 2024 Provider Preview Reports in their CASPER folders. The preview period lasts from February 14 to March 16, although reports will be available for an additional 30 days after the preview period ends. CMS encourages providers to download and save their Hospice Provider Preview Reports for future reference, as they will no longer be available in CASPER after this 60-day period. CMS has also published new resources for hospice providers related to the Hospice Quality Reporting Program (HQRP). The <u>Hospice Comprehensive Assessment QC Background and Methodology Fact Sheet</u> provides an overview of the Hospice Comprehensive Assessment Quality Measure, including clarification of scoring methodology and FAQs. In addition, the <u>HIS Manual</u> has been updated to reflect minor changes in terminology related to the Consensus-based Entity (CBE). The manual changes do not impact current data sets and no changes have been made to the content of the HIS Admission or HIS Discharge.
