MedPAC March Meetings

The Medicare Payment Advisory Commission (MedPAC) is hosting meetings on March 7 and 8. Presentations include reforming Medicare's wage index system, evaluating a prototype design for post-acute care prospective payment system, and Medicare Advantage payment policy. Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality Requesting Topic Suggestions

The Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) is requesting topics for future evidence reports. Evidence reports are reviews of relevant scientific research to provide information to consumers, clinicians, and policymakers. These reports are provided at no cost and can help improve the understanding of programs, inequities, and issues. Topics can be submitted on the AHRQ website.

QUALITY

Hospice Quality Reporting Program (HQRP) Updates

Care Compare February Refresh: Publicly reported hospice quality data have been refreshed on Care Compare. Quality measures updated with the February 2024 refresh include Hospice Item Set Comprehensive Assessment Measure, CAHPS® Hospice Survey Family Caregiver Experience, and CAHPS® Star ratings. NHPCO members should access the Quality Alerts and Updates webpage to download the complete Quality Alert (dated 2/21/24) for more information.

Open Door Forum (ODF): CMS held a Home Health, Hospice, and DME Open Door Forum on Thursday, February 22. CMS staff communicated that CAHPS® Provider Preview Reports for the May 2024 refresh have been delayed and should be available on February 28. The 30-day preview period for CAHPS® data will begin the same day reports are made available. Members should check their CASPER folders and reach out to quality@nhpco.org if they have not received their CAHPS® preview reports. Members are also encouraged to sign up for the CMS ODF Mailing List to receive future communications regarding Open Door Forums. A recording and transcript of the ODF will be posted at CMS Open Door Forum Podcasts and Transcripts.

Key Dates Webpage Updates: The HQRP <u>Public Reporting: Key Dates for Providers</u> webpage has been updated with refresh dates for 2024, however there are errors noted on the page. CMS has confirmed that CAHPS measure reporting schedules have not changed and that corrections to the page are in progress. Members are encouraged to visit the page to review refresh schedules, data corrections deadlines, and submission deadlines.

Project ECHO Miniseries: Best Practices in Dementia Care

NHPCO, in collaboration with the Alzheimer's Association, will host a new Project ECHO miniseries beginning March 7. This seven-session, weekly miniseries focuses on implementation of evidence-based dementia care, specifically in serious illness and at the end of life, and will support and enhance the ability of providers across the continuum of care to understand the unique needs of persons living with various facets of cognitive impairment. - Hospice Compliance Certificate Program (HCCP): This program covers the basics of healthcare compliance, including developing a compliance program, compliance risk assessment, compliance policies and procedures, and anonymous reporting.
- <u>Hospice Conditions of Participation</u>: This module reviews hospice levels of care and presents application scenarios for participants. The module also discusses the provision of hospice care in nursing facilities, a regulatory "hot spot" for providers today.

2024 National Impact Assessment of CMS Quality Measures Report

Chapter 2: National Findings on Health Equity provides both quantitative and qualitative data in support of CMS' drive to advance health equity and inform future quality measure development. The first section of the chapter summarizes analyses to determine whether population groups differed in quality measure performance at a national level. The second section summarizes results from focus groups representing underserved communities convened to examine drivers of disparities in healthcare delivery and health outcomes. The chapter concludes by identifying lessons learned that CMS is addressing to support measurement which advances health equity for underserved communities.

Transformative Research to Address Health Disparities and Advance Health Equity

This grant from the <u>National Institutes of Health (NIH)</u> supports intervention research addressing social determinants of health which would have a major impact on preventing, reducing, or eliminating health disparities and advancing health equity. If interested, the deadline to apply is March 22.

Foundations of Population Health Management in Priority Populations Learning Series

Part one of this four-part webinar series from the <u>National Nurse-Led Care Consortium</u> will cover the importance of employing a population health approach to the prevention, treatment, and management of chronic conditions among priority populations. Speakers will share current research, examples, and best practices for a population health approach to chronic disease management and provide context for the following three webinars in the series. Priority populations include residents of public housing, agricultural workers, patients experiencing homelessness, and other at-risk populations such as older adults and Asian American, Pacific Islander, and Native Hawaiian patients. Continuing education credits are available.
