MedPAC Publishes March 2024 Report to Congress

On Friday, March 15, the Medicare Payment Advisory Commission (MedPAC) released its <u>March</u> <u>2024 Report to Congress</u>, including its hospice chapter. In the report, MedPAC recommended "[f]or fiscal year 2025, the Congress should eliminate the update to the 2024 Medicare base payment rates for hospice." MedPAC is an advisory body that makes recommendations to Congress. Even with a unanimous vote in favor of any recommendation, Congress must adopt the legislative changes to put these recommendations into effect. NHPCO sent out <u>a policy alert</u> on Friday with a breakdown of key points of the report.

REGULATORY & COMPLIANCE

CMS Updates the Hospice Model Election Statement Example

On March 11, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) updated the Hospice Model Election Statement in response to a meeting held last week with NHPCO and the National Association for Home Care & Hospice (NAHC). Changes include election addendum provision timeframe modifications to be consistent with regulatory timeframes revised in 2021, as well as additional language to the representative's signature to clarify that this is the beneficiary's representative if the beneficiary is unable to sign. The updated Model Hospice Election Statement can be found on the <u>CMS Hospice website</u>. NHPCO strongly encourages hospices to use this Model Election Statement.

Change Healthcare Updates Timeline for Cyberattack Recovery

In February, Change Healthcare experienced a cyberattack that disrupted several of its network and system operations. Change Healthcare recently <u>updated</u> its timeline for restoring operations in response to a cyberattack, stating that electronic payment functionality will be available beginning March 15 and connectivity to the claims network and software would be reestablished on March 18. In response to this attack and its adverse impact on our nation's healthcare system, on March 5, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services released a <u>statement</u> providing instructions to providers impacted by this incident.

Hospice Medical Director and Administrator Reporting Instructions

Last month, the CMS <u>MLN Connects newsletter</u> clarified "that hospice and skilled nursing facility medical directors and administrators are always considered managing employees for Medicare provider enrollment purposes. You must report all current managing employees. If you haven't reported a medical director or administrator, report them now." This newsletter suggests that hospices should report any missing hospice medical director or administrator as soon as possible and should not wait for Medicare revalidation. Hospices can obtain information about the Change of Information process for reporting their medical director and administrator on the <u>CMS enrollment website</u>.

NHPCO Updates Website with Physician Enrollment Requirements

Beginning May 1, 2024, a physician must be enrolled in or validly opted out of Medicare at the time they certify a patient's terminal illness for Medicare to pay for hospice services. NHPCO recently updated its <u>website</u> to provide additional information about this requirement. NHPCO strongly encourages hospice providers to engage with physician partners to ensure that services are covered beginning May 1. Please reach out to <u>regulatory@nhpco.org</u> with any questions.
