# HHS Releases Resource Guide for Providers Impacted by Change Healthcare Cyberattack

On March 25, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) released a <u>resource</u> <u>guide</u> with health plan contact information to support providers who have been impacted by the Change Healthcare cyberattack. Earlier this month, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) also announced <u>flexibilities</u> to help state Medicaid programs offer relief to providers impacted by the cyberattack. This follows a <u>"Dear Colleague" letter</u>, issued by the HHS Office of Civil Rights, announcing the opening of an investigation into the incident.

#### CMS Releases Health-Related Social Needs FAQs

On March 21, CMS released <u>FAQs</u> about four services intended to address health-related social needs, including Caregiver Training Services (CTS), Community Health Integration (CHI) services, Principal Illness Navigation (PIN) services, and Social Determinants of Health Risk Assessment (SDOH RA). This guidance addresses frequently asked questions about billing for these services under the Medicare Physician Fee Schedule.

CMS released <u>technical revisions</u> to the <u>CAHPS® Quality Assurance Guidelines</u>. These revisions primarily impact members who distribute CAHPS® survey instruments in languages other than English. For more information, reach out
