CMS Releases FY 2025 Hospice Wage Index and Payment Rate Update Proposed Rule

On March 28, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released the <u>fiscal year (FY)</u> 2025 <u>Hospice Wage Index and Payment Rate Update</u> proposed rule, which includes:

- A 2.6% rate increase
- A hospice cap amount of \$34,364.85
- Changes to wage index statistical areas
- Proposals for the Hospice Outcomes and Patient Evaluation (HOPE) instrument
- Updates to the CAHPS® Hospice Survey and quality measures
- Clarifications to the hospice Conditions of Participation
- Two requests for information

NHPCO issued a <u>statement</u> in response to the rule late last week, and an analysis of the proposed rule in the April 2 <u>regulatory alert</u>. On **April 25, 2-3 p.m. ET**, NHPCO will also host a <u>webinar</u> on the proposed rule.

The Regulatory and Compliance team has begun preparing formal comments in coordination with the NHPCO Regulatory Committee and national hospice stakeholder organizations. Thoughts, input, and suggestions are welcomed during this process. OMB Updates Federal Race and Ethnicity Standards

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has implemented comprehensive revisions to its standards for race and ethnicity classification, adopting several recommendations from NHPCO's <u>comment letter</u>. Key updates include:

Providing a single question for race and ethnicity and permitting multiple responses

- Adding a separate Middle Eastern or North African (MENA) category as a minimum reporting category
- Mandating more detailed data collection unless an exemption is granted by OMB due to potential burdens or privacy concerns
- Modernizing terminology
- Requiring federal agencies to develop Action Plans on Race and Ethnicity Data

These adjustments aim to ensure uniformity and comparability of race and ethnicity data across federal agencies immediately, with complete compliance mandated within five years (by March 28, 2029). Federal agencies are directed to update their surveys and forms as soon as possible, with a public compliance plan due within 18 months. This represents a significant shift, as previous OMB guidance on race and ethnicity data collection has remained significantly unchanged since the issuance of SPD15 in 1977. REGULATORY & COMPLIANCE

Hospice PEPPER Distribution Delayed Through Fall 2024

There remains a temporary pause for the distribution of comparative billing reports (CBRs) and Program for Evaluating Payment Patterns Electronic Reports (PEPPERs) through the fall of 2024. This means hospices will not be able to access their PEPPERs in April 2024. CMS has indicated the agency will release a Request for Information (RFI) in the coming months to improve the quality and accessibility of these reports. CMS Updates Ordering and Referring Data File to Include Hospices

Beginning May 1, 2024, physicians must be enrolled in or validly opted out of Medicare in order to certify a patient's terminal illness under the Medicare hospice benefit. CMS has indicated hospices should refer to the Ordering and Referring Data File (ORDF) to determine a physician's Medicare enrollment or opt-out status. The ORDF has been updated to include a column for hospices, similar to existing columns for DMEPOS and HHAs. NHPCO strongly encourages hospice providers to engage with physician partners now to ensure services are covered beginning May 1. Any questions can be directed to regulatory@nhpco.org.

Open Door Forum

CMS held a Home Health, Hospice, and DME Open Door Forum (ODF) on Wednesday, April 3 and provided updates on the HOPE Tool, CAHPS survey, and other elements of the HQRP impacted

End of First Quarter: The first quarter of the Quality Connections (QC) 2024 program year ended on March 31, 2024. All activities completed through that date will be included in the year-end Achievement Map update in mid-April. Organizations that have earned rings or completed the program will receive an achievement logo to add to their online and print collateral, demonstrating their commitment to quality improvement.

QC Evaluation Surveys: QC participants are asked to complete the Pre- and Post-Assessment surveys located on their dashboard landing page. These evaluations provide important information in planning future Quality Connections offerings.
