NHPCO Joint Webinar on Upcoming Physician Enrollment Requirements

Beginning May 1, 2024, physicians must be enrolled in or validly opted out of Medicare to certify a patient's terminal illness under the Medicare hospice benefit. Last week, NHPCO partnered with the National Association for Home Care & Hospice to provide a webinar on upcoming physician enrollment requirements. Request for Information (RFI) on Potential Hospice Quality Reporting Program Social Determinants of Health

On April 4, CMS published the <u>FY 2025 Hospice Wage Index and Payment Rate Update</u>. With the proposed rule, CMS asks for feedback on different topics as they develop the final rule for FY 2025 and future payment policies. These requests are an opportunity to provide CMS with "onthe-ground" experiences in providing care to Medicare beneficiaries. NHPCO requests information from providers regarding the **RFI on Potential Hospice Quality Reporting Program Social Determinants of Health Items** included in the proposed rule. REGULATORY & COMPLIANCE

Hospice PEPPER Distribution Delayed Through Fall 2024

There remains a temporary pause for the distribution of comparative billing reports (CBRs) and Program for Evaluating Payment Patterns Electronic Reports (PEPPERs) through the fall of 2024. This means hospices will not be able to access their PEPPERs in April 2024. CMS has indicated the agency will release a Request for Information (RFI) in the coming months to improve the quality and accessibility of these reports. CMS provided updates on the future of the Hospice Outcomes and Patient Evaluation (HOPE) in the FY 2025 Hospice Wage Index and Payment Rate Update Quality Reporting Proposed Rule. End of First Quarter: The first quarter of the Quality Connections (QC) 2024 program year ended on March 31. Top Ten Tips Palliative Care Clinicians Should Know About Dignity-Conserving Practice

The acknowledgment and promotion of dignity is commonly viewed as the cornerstone of person-centered care. Although the preservation of dignity is often highlighted as a key tenet of palliative care provision, the concept of dignity and its implications for practice remain nebulous to many clinicians. There are several principles of care that can enhance dignity, including

affirming the person's value, viewing whole persons apart from their disease, addressing pain and discomfort, dealing with fears and anxieties, and helping people maintain a feeling of control and independence. This article, written by a team of palliative care specialists and dignity researchers, and published in the current edition of the *Journal of Palliative Medicine*, offers 10 evidence-based tips to facilitate the implementation of dignity-centered care in serious illness.

The World Health Organization (WHO) developed the <u>Operational Framework for Monitoring</u> <u>Social Determinants of Health Equity</u> to measure, assess, and address the social determinants of health and health inequities from a cross-sectorial perspective. The framework provides countries with critical guidance on monitoring the social determinants of health and actions addressing them, and how to use data for policy action across sectors to improve health equity.
