CMS Issues New Hospice Claims Edits for Physician Enrollment Requirements

Beginning May 1, 2024, physicians must be enrolled in or validly opted out of Medicare to certify a patient's terminal illness under the Medicare hospice benefit. On April 17, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) issued <u>Change Request (CR) 13531</u>, which implements additional edits on hospice claims for hospice certifying physician Medicare enrollment requirements with an implementation date of October 7, 2024. The CR implements additional

edits to verify the enrollment status of the attending physician and referring physician fields on the hospice claim. NHPCO continues to engage with CMS on enrollment challenges pursuant to this requirement. REGULATORY & COMPLIANCE

NHPCO Proposed FY 2025 Medicare State/County Rate Chart Now Available

On March 28, CMS released the <u>Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 Hospice Wage Index and Payment Rate</u> <u>Update</u> proposed rule, which includes a 2.6% rate increase and a hospice cap amount of \$34,364.85. In response to this rule, NHPCO has updated its <u>Proposed FY 2025 Medicare</u> <u>State/County Rate Charts</u>. We made strategic macro enhancements to the rate charts to enhance usability, ensuring our members can easily access specific information tailored to state and county levels. This improvement is part of our ongoing commitment to improve the experience of our members and provide timely, accurate data to support your needs. CMS Releases Medicare Advantage, Medicare Part D, and PACE Final Rule

On April 4, CMS released the <u>Medicare Advantage and the Medicare Prescription Drug Benefit</u> <u>Program for Contract Year (CY) 2024 and Remaining Provisions and Contract Year 2025 Policy</u> <u>and Technical Changes</u> final rule, which includes updates to Medicare Advantage, the Medicare Prescription Drug Benefit, and Programs of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE), and finalizes remaining provisions of the <u>CY 2024 Medicare Advantage and Part D</u> proposed rule. Quality Connections

First Quarter Achievement: Congratulations to the 34 member organizations that closed rings in Quality Connections (QC) in the third quarter, including 22 organizations that closed all four rings and completed the program! The <u>Quality Connections Achievement Map</u> was updated on April 15, reflecting all activities completed through March 31.

QC Foundations: Members that are new to Quality Connections are encouraged to complete QC Foundations, designed to introduce participants to the structure of the program and provide a sample of the type of content they'll find throughout.

QC Evaluation Surveys: QC participants are asked to complete the Pre- and Post-Assessment surveys located on their dashboard landing page. These evaluations provide important information in planning future Quality Connections offerings.

Updated Hospice Quality Reporting Program (HQRP) Resources

An updated *Timeliness Compliance Threshold for HIS Submissions: Fact Sheet* has been posted to the <u>HQRP Requirements and Best Practices</u> page. This document is designed to assist providers in successfully meeting the HQRP requirements, understanding the compliance threshold, and monitoring their hospice's timely compliance using the **Hospice Timeliness Compliance Threshold Report.** CMS updated the current Hospice Item Set (HIS) Manual to incorporate a change in the expiration date for the manual and both the Admission and Discharge Item sets. Adjustments were made to the footers, examples, and tables to reflect more current dates along with minor corrections. The updated Manual can be downloaded from the <u>HQRP: Hospice Item Set</u> webpage.

LEGAL AFFAIRS

Congress Urges CMS to Stop Hospice Fraud

A bipartisan sign-on letter circulates Congress, urging CMS to take immediate action to stamp out fraud within the hospice benefit. This letter is a response to repeated requests for action from Congress to CMS. In 2023, despite a statewide mortarium on new hospices in California, CMS certified an additional 15 hospices in a two-story building in LA that already houses over 100 certified hospices. Flagrant abuse of vulnerable patients and our healthcare system must be stopped. <u>Take action today</u> and ask your Members of Congress to sign in support of this letter.

Request for Information (RFI) on Potential Hospice Quality Reporting Program Social Determinants of Health

On April 4, CMS published the <u>FY 2025 Hospice Wage Index and Payment Rate Update</u>. With the proposed rule, CMS asks for feedback on different topics as they develop the final rule for FY 2025 and future payment policies. These requests are an opportunity to provide CMS with "on-the-ground" experiences in providing care to Medicare beneficiaries. NHPCO requests information from providers regarding the RFI on Potential Hospice Quality Reporting Program Social Determinants of Health Items included in the proposed rule. <u>Please complete the survey</u> by May 10. Impact Wellbeing[™] Guide: Taking Action to Improve Healthcare Worker Wellbeing

The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health and the Dr. Lorna Breen Heroes' Foundation published the <u>Impact Wellbeing Guide</u> to help hospital leaders and executives accelerate or supplement professional wellbeing work in their hospitals at the operational level. The guide includes six, evidence-informed actions that aim to improve the professional wellbeing of all healthcare workers, no matter title or department, and strengthen hospital operations.

Community-Level Innovations for Improving Health Outcomes Funding Opportunity

The Community Level Innovations for Improving Health Outcomes <u>grant</u> from the HHS Office of Minority Health is for community-level innovations that demonstrate reducing barriers related to social determinants of health can increase the use of preventive health services and make progress toward leading health indicator targets.
