# NHPCO and NAHC Joint Town Hall - Today at 4 p.m. ET!

NHPCO and the National Association for Home Care & Hospice (NAHC) continue to explore the formation of a new, as-yet unnamed, organization combining their strengths to create a better resource and advocate for the home care, hospice, palliative, and serious-illness care community. # CMS To Delay Implementation of Physician Enrollment Requirements

On April 22, NHPCO and NAHC met with CMS to address implementation challenges associated with the requirement that physicians must be enrolled or validly opted out of Medicare to certify a patient's terminal illness under the Medicare hospice benefit. Following our meeting, CMS issued a new Questions and Answers (Q&A) Document, which provides additional guidance regarding hospice certifying physician enrollment requirements. Today, CMS alerted us that the May 1 live date for the hospice certifying physician enrollment requirement will be delayed to Monday, June 3. # NHPCO Updates Proposed FY 2025 Medicare State/County Rate Chart

Last week, NHPCO completed its Proposed FY 2025 Medicare State/County Rate Charts for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 Hospice Wage Index and Payment Rate Update proposed rule, which includes strategic macro enhancements to enhance their usability, ensuring that our members can more easily access specific information tailored to state and county levels. NHPCO recently updated the rate charts to include additional instructions for enabling macros, technical updates to capture wage index values with the application of a 5% reduction cap, and minor formatting changes. # CMS Releases Medicaid Final Rules, SNF Minimum Staffing Final Rule

On April 22, CMS released three different rules, including:

- Ensuring Access to Medicaid Services | CMS Fact Sheet
- Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) Managed Care Access, Finance, and Quality | CMS Fact Sheet
- Minimum Staffing Standards for Long-Term Care Facilities and Medicaid Institutional Payment Transparency Reporting | CMS Fact Sheet

Through the Medicaid rules, CMS aims to ensure comprehensive coverage and access to Medicaid services through several regulatory changes and prioritize the quality and accessibility of managed care under Medicaid and CHIP programs. While the Minimum Staffing Standards final rule does not apply to hospice providers, there could be impacts to the healthcare workforce at large.

## FTC Issues Final Rule Banning Non-Competes Nationwide

On April 23, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) approved a final rule that will ban non-compete contracts nationwide. In a <u>statement</u>, the FTC indicated, "Under the FTC's new rule, existing non-competes for the vast majority of workers will no longer be enforceable after the rule's effective date." The final rule exempts senior executives who have an existing non-compete contract;

however, it prohibits employers from enforcing new non-competes, even for senior executives. The final rule is effective 120 days after publication in the Federal Register.

The Project ECHO miniseries presented by NHPCO and The Alzheimer's Association, *Best Practices in Dementia Care*, has concluded. The seven-session series covered a range of topics in dementia care at the end of life and provided attendees with the opportunity to discuss challenges and share successes in the field. # Quality in Motion: Acting on the CMS National Quality Strategy

CMS has released <u>Quality in Motion</u>: Acting on the <u>CMS National Quality Strategy</u>, the latest update to the 2022 <u>National Quality Strategy</u>. This document serves as an action plan outlining how CMS is putting quality-focused goals into motion in four priority areas: outcomes and alignment, equity and engagement, safety and resiliency, and interoperability and scientific advancement. Hospice providers are encouraged to review the report to identify CMS strategies related to improving quality and health outcomes across the care continuum, advancing health equity, avoiding preventable harm, accelerating interoperability, and additional goals with the potential to impact future developments in post-acute care quality. ### RFI on Potential Hospice Quality Reporting Program Social Determinants of Health

On April 4, CMS published the <u>FY 2025 Hospice Wage Index and Payment Rate Update</u>. With the proposed rule, CMS asks for feedback on different topics as they develop the final rule for FY 2025 and future payment policies. These requests are an opportunity to provide CMS with "onthe-ground" experiences in providing care to Medicare beneficiaries. NHPCO requests information from providers regarding the RFI on Potential Hospice Quality Reporting Program Social Determinants of Health Items included in the proposed rule. <u>Please complete the survey</u> by May 10.
