CMS Held Hospice November Forum

On November 14, CMS held a webinar to share updates on the Hospice Quality Reporting Program with a focus on hospice provisions in the calendar year (CY) 2024 <u>Home Health</u> <u>Prospective Payment System final rule</u>. In this webinar, CMS discussed the final hospice special focus program (SFP) and informal dispute resolution process. NHPCO will be following up with CMS for clarification regarding timing and implementation of the SFP set to begin in 2024. REGULATORY & COMPLIANCE

CMS Finalizes Hospice IDG Changes in CY 2024 Physician Fee Schedule Final Rule

On November 3, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released the <u>calendar year</u> (CY) 2024 Payment Policies under the Physician Fee Schedule and Other Changes to Part B Payment and Coverage Policies final rule, which implements provisions of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023, to include mental health counselors (MHCs) and marriage and family therapists (MFTs) as part of the hospice interdisciplinary group (IDG) beginning January 1, 2024. Consistent with NHPCO's recommendation, CMS will only require hospices to include one social worker, one MFT, or one MHC on the IDG – not all three. CMS to Host Home Health, Hospice, and DME Open Door Forum

CMS will host the next Home Health, Hospice, and DME Open Door Forum on Wednesday, November 29 from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m. ET. CMS will discuss the CY 2024 Home Health final rule, CY 2024 Physician Fee Schedule final rule, and quality reporting. The Open Door Forum is a great opportunity to ask CMS questions. CMS has changed the format to a Zoom meeting, so you must <u>register to attend</u>.

OIG Releases New General Compliance Program Guidance

On November 6, the Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General (OIG) released the <u>General Compliance Program Guidance (GCPC)</u>. The GCPC is voluntary guidance for healthcare stakeholders on compliance risks and programs and includes information on Federal law, program infrastructure, and other resources. OIG Releases New Report on Use of Medicare Data to Identify Potential Abuse and Neglect

On November 7, the Department of Health and Human Services OIG released a report titled '<u>CMS Can Do More To Leverage Medicare Claims Data To Identify Unreported Incidents of</u> <u>Potential Abuse or Neglect</u>.' This report discusses findings from an audit of Medicare claims to identify cases of potential abuse or neglect. CMS concurred with OIG recommendations, noting the agency would prioritize state agency survey and complaint oversight, develop additional guidance for providers, and evaluate all available evidence pertaining to abuse and neglect when assessing revisions to provider conditions of participation. HQRP Updates

CMS HQRP Hospice Outreach September 2023: On September 19, CMS posted a <u>Hospice</u> <u>Outreach Email</u> with important updates on the HQRP, including compliance reminders, HQRP webpage updates, and links to HQRP trainings. Providers are strongly encouraged to download the Outreach Email and sign up for <u>Quality Reporting Updates</u>. If you would like to receive these quarterly update emails, reach out to <u>QRPHelp@swingtech.com</u> with your organization's name, CCN, and desired email contacts.

Care Compare November Refresh: Care Compare will refresh during November. Updates will include HIS, CAHPS®, and Claims-Based measures. Star ratings will not refresh until February. Per the <u>CY 2024 Home Health Prospective Payment Update Rule</u>, data from November 2023 will be used to identify the pool of hospices eligible for the Hospice Special Focus Program. Members are encouraged to visit the <u>NHPCO Regulatory and Compliance Center</u> for more information.

Demographic Corrections: On September 26, CMS added a new page to the HQRP website, <u>How</u> <u>to Update Hospice Demographic Data</u>, which provides updated instructions for providers to request demographic corrections on Care Compare. Members seeking demographic corrections are encouraged to review the new page as well as the <u>HQRP Quarterly Q&A for Q2 2023</u> for more information.
