Honoring the Memory of Roslaynn Carter

On Sunday at age 96, Rosalynn Carter died peacefully at home in Plains, Georgia with family by her side. Last Friday, November 17, it was <u>publicly announced</u> that the former first lady had entered hospice care. Rosalynn Carter shares a legacy with her husband, former President Jimmy Carter, as a devoted humanitarian. She will be remembered for her lifelong work fighting to combat the stigmas often associated with mental health. As a team, the Carters revolutionized the postpresidency with a focus on human rights and world peace through the





Carter Center. <u>The Carter Center</u> has created a <u>website</u> paying tribute to her, and has <u>shared</u> <u>this page</u> for all to express condolences and remembrances with the Carter family.

Hospice Provider Preview Reports for February 2024 Now Available

Providers can now access February 2024 Provider Preview Reports in their CASPER folders. The preview period lasts from November 15, 2023 to December 15, 2023, although reports will be available for an additional 30 days after the preview period ends. CMS encourages providers to download and save their Hospice Provider Preview Reports for future reference, as they will no longer be available in CASPER after this 60-day period. Care Compare Refresh

Publicly reported hospice quality data have been refreshed on <u>Care Compare</u>. Quality measures updated with the November 2023 refresh include: Hospice Item Set Comprehensive Assessment Measure, CAHPS® Hospice Survey Family Caregiver Experience, Hospice Care Index, and Hospice Visits in Last Days of Life. Members are encouraged to download NHPCO's *Charting a Course to Quality: A Consumer Guide to Publicly Reported Quality Measures* and its companion document, the HQRP Comprehensive Resource Guide, to engage staff, board members, and external stakeholders in public reporting.
