CMS Hosts Hospice Open Door Forum

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) hosted a Home Health, Hospice, and DME Open Door Forum (ODF) on Wednesday, November 29. During the call, CMS announced the agency is putting together a Frequently Asked Question (FAQ) document to address common questions concerning the inclusion of the marriage and family therapist (MFT) and mental health counselors (MHC) on the hospice interdisciplinary group (IDG). CMS stated hospices are not required to have an MFT or MHC on staff but, if they do, a qualified MFT and MHC must be employed as a W2 employee or volunteer. In addition, hospices have the choice between MFT or MHC to select for an IDG. Other topics discussed included reminders about available resources on the <u>CMS HQRP: Provider and Stakeholder Engagement</u> webpage and an overview of Care Compare preview reports and refresh dates.

REGULATORY & COMPLIANCE

Physician Medicare Enrollment Requirements for Hospice Certification to Begin May 1, 2024

Beginning May 1, 2024, CMS will require hospice certifying physicians to either be enrolled in or validly opted-out of the Medicare program to certify hospice services. This requirement will apply to both the hospice physician throughout the recertification process *and* the attending physician (if the patient has one) at the time of initial certification. As only physicians can certify a patient's terminal illness under the Medicare hospice benefit, this requirement does not extend to non-physician practitioners designated as a patient's attending physician. Hospices may verify the Medicare enrollment status of a physician through CMS' <u>Ordering and Referring Data File</u> (ORDF). For more information, reach out to regulatory@nhpco.org.

Updated CMS 855A Enrollment Form Now Available

The Office of Management and Budget recently revised Form CMS-855A, 'Medicare Enrollment Application for Institutional Providers,' to include additional ownership information among other changes. CMS began accepting submissions of the <u>revised form</u> on November 17, 2023. Providers may continue using the prior version of the enrollment form through December 17, 2023. After this time, the revised enrollment form must be used. For calendar year 2024, CMS <u>announced</u> a \$709 application fee for newly enrolling or revalidating institutional providers or those with new practice locations.

NHPCO Collecting Signatures for Rural Letter to Congress

NHPCO is collecting organizational signatures from rural and frontier providers for a letter to Congress. QUALITY

HQRP Updates

- Publicly reported hospice quality data has been refreshed on <u>Care Compare</u>. Quality measures updated with the November 2023 refresh include: Hospice Item Set Comprehensive Assessment Measure, CAHPS[®] Hospice Survey Family Caregiver Experience, Hospice Care Index, and Hospice Visits in Last Days of Life. NHPCO members should access the <u>Quality Alerts and Updates</u> webpage to download the complete Quality Alert (dated 11/22/23) for more information.
- Providers can now access February 2024 Provider Preview Reports in their CASPER folders. The preview period lasts from November 15, 2023 to December 15, 2023, although reports will be available for an additional 30 days after the preview period ends. CMS encourages providers to download and save their Hospice Provider Preview Reports for future reference, as they will no longer be available in CASPER after this 60-day period. - CAHPS Size Exemptions for hospices that served fewer than 50 survey-eligible decedents in 2023 are due no later than December 31, 2023. For more information, visit the <u>CMS</u> <u>HQRP: CAHPS Survey</u> webpage.

The call to action asks partners across healthcare, social care, public and environmental health, government, and health information technology organizations to take action to promote system transformation and collaboration.
